

Lent Bible Studies





Backpack Update: It is so surprising that we are already ordering food for the Spring distribution! Because Easter is early this year, we are planning for our Spring distribution with a delivery on February 26th of frozen chicken, eggs, cereal, yogurt! Our next distribution will be on Wednesday, March 27th. We distributed 44 boxes of food on February 15th, with so many families expressing their gratitude.

There is really good news in Scotia-Glenville! On the third Wednesday of each month there will be a FREE distribution of fresh produce, meat, and dairy products at the parking lot of the First National Bank of Scotia, from 6:00-7:30 pm. No identification is needed---you just show up and choose what you need! It is called the Fresh Table Community Pop-up Pantry. Please let your neighbors that need this fresh food about this service. The dates are the following: March 20, April 17, May 15, June 19, July 17. This is sponsored by the Regional Food Bank and volunteers in our community.

Health and Wellness Note:

Easter is early this year, March 31. Chances are you may be thinking about Easter baskets soon. If you would like them filled with less candy, you may be thinking about alternatives. However, crackers, including goldfish, are not the healthiest alternative. Kids love carbs, but cracker snacks, which are high in sodium, are a bad choice for your child's oral health. Graham crackers, goldfish crackers, and other types of crackers all turn into sugar once they're on your child's teeth, which means **they increase the risk of cavities as much as eating candy does**. They can also cause constipation in children. So this year look towards the fresh fruit aisle.

Health & Wellness HEART HEALTH DAY on Sunday, March 17

We will be offering Naloxone training and "HANDS ONLY Resuscitation" after 10 o'clock worship. After the cardiac arrest of Damar Hamlin, during a Buffalo Bills football game, people expressed a desire to learn resuscitation. With the increased number of drug overdoses publicized and education about drug addiction, people are more aware how Naloxone can reverse an overdose and are interested in training. Here are the opportunities available:

- 1. **Walter Pfuntner, Jr.**, who grew up at FRCS and is a Beukendahl EMT, will be teaching official Naloxone training. After the training is complete, <u>free kits</u> will be distributed to those who attend.
- 2. **Rev. Kent Busman**, Director of Camp Fowler, will teach "Hands Only Resuscitation," which is an easy, effective non-certified way for any bystander, especially if they act immediately, to double or triple the chances of someone surviving a cardiac arrest. The presentation will be in Brink Hall so all can observe and see. Manikins will be available for those that wish to practice.

Remember, with training, you too, can save a life!
