Our Life in Worship

WELCOME! We are so glad that you have joined us this morning to worship God! We strive to be a warm and welcoming community of Christian people who seek to follow the example of our Lord Jesus Christ in all that we do. You are encouraged to introduce yourself to the pastor and to those around you.

IF YOU ARE VISITING US FOR THE FIRST TIME - We encourage you to fill out a visitor card which you can find in each pew with the offering envelopes. Once completed these can be given to an usher so we can contact you. If you would rather, there is also a QR Code on the narthex bulletin board, which will allow you to digitally submit to us the same information. We also have a welcome bag for you, please speak to an usher to receive one.

LISTENING DEVICES & LARGE-PRINT BULLETINS - are available for those who need them. Speak to an usher if you would like to try one.

RESTROOMS - There is one restroom just off the narthex. Other bathrooms are through the door on the right-hand side of the sanctuary then to the left or down the long hall to the right.

FAITH FORMATION - December's theme: "From the Manger." Today grades 6-12 are encouraged to stay in worship. Grades K-5 can choose to stay in worship or go up with Miss Diana for a time of learning.

NURSERY CARE - Nursery care for children, infant through 4 years old, is available every Sunday from 9:30am to 11:30am. The nursery is located in the first room on the right as you exit the sanctuary down the education wing. There are toys, games, books and a changing table and diapers. Parents are welcome to stay in the nursery with their little one(s) if they would like. We ask that a parent stay with babies younger than six months old.

CHRISTMAS EVE - There are two opportunities for you to celebrate Christmas Eve here at First. First, at 5:30pm will be our youth-led Christmas Pageant in the Sanctuary. Then our Musical Prologue will begin at 7:30pm with our Traditional Candlelight Lessons & Carols Service beginning at 8:00pm. All are welcome!

NEXT SUNDAY - We welcome the Rev. Dr. Viki Brooks to the pulpit. Rev. Dr. Brooks is a retired Presbyterian minister who served as a chaplain at Union College for 20 years. This congregation has been blessed to have had her as a part of our worshipping community for some time now. We thank her for her willingness to preach and give Pastor Christopher an opportunity to rest and be with his family for the holidays.
