This document is designed to help us work together to most effectively meet these needs.

Items We Will Accept for FRCS Sales:

- Clean, gently used clothing, shoes & socks, outerwear, purses & accessories
- Household linens, towels, & bedding
- Everyday household items such as kitchen supplies, small electrical appliances and tools. *(Plates, bowls, and glasses must be dishwasher and microwave safe)*
- *Small furniture (end tables, small bookcases, etc – must be easy to lift and store)*
- Toys
- Books
- CDs, DVDs, cassettes
- Jewelry *(Donations can be dropped off at the office, M-F, 9:00am-1:00pm)*
- Sporting Goods

*Did you know that we have a **St. Pauly's drop off**? See the small shed to the right of our green shed! Items accepted are used clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, linens, pillowcases, blankets, curtains, and stuffed animals. What We Will NOT Accept: *(See options below for options to donate or recycling these items.)*

- Monitors, TVs or computer screens
- Computers, printers, keyboards or stereos
- Tires
- Large or upholstered furniture - See options below.
- Candles or cosmetics (new or used)
- Office supplies
- Nothing musty, moldy, or broken. Please dispose of, recycling where possible!

NOTE: Receiving these items costs FRCS staff & volunteer effort and time, as well as money for disposal, reducing the financial benefits of our sale. That reduces the benefits for our missions including our food insecurity programs!
